Our student delegates stay with Japanese families in homestay accommodations, immersing themselves in the daily routines, customs, and traditions of a typical Japanese family. During our program, delegates engage in a variety of educational activities, in past years this has included ikebana, kayaking, sports chanbara, sea fishing, making mochi and udon, experiencing traditional tea ceremony, visiting temples and shrines, and participating in a summer festival parade. Our program focuses on cultural immersion and language exchange, fostering a deeper appreciation for cross-cultural understanding and international friendship. Through this transformative experience, delegates not only expand their personal horizons, but also strengthen the longstanding friendship between Sausalito and Sakaide.
